## The President's Corner

As I'm getting ready for Chanukah, while looking for recipes for other kinds of latkes besides the traditional potato, I am also thinking a lot about the meaning of the Chanukah lights. We all know the the eight candles represent the miracle of the small vial of oil lasting eight days, until a new supply of pure oil could be obtained to light the menorah in the Beit Hamikdash, when the Assyrians, who had conquered and Hellenized the Temple, were forced out. On another level, the miracle was that a small group Jews, under Judah the Maccabee, were able to oust the Assyrian army. There are many other layers of Rabbinic and scholarly interpretations of the miracle. Chanukah is also one of those few holidays that is celebrated at home, with our families and friends. So I think about the Chanukah lights in personal and family-related terms.

These are some of my associations. When I was a young child, a rabbi explained that a single, small light could illuminate a whole room. I remember that for me as a young girl, the realization of that fact was like a miracle. The message was that a small child, a frail elderly person, or any small deed could make a huge

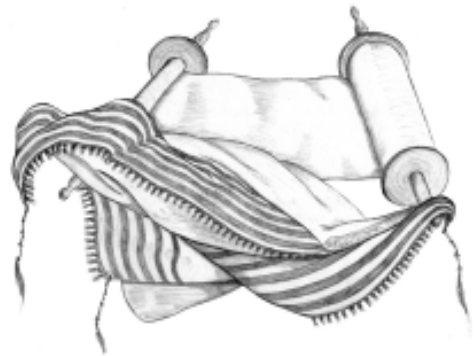
2. Baruch Atah Hashem Elokeinu Melech Ha-olam She-asa Nisim La-avoseinu bayamim Haheim Bazman Hazeh. Blessed are you, Lord our G-d, King of the universe, who wrought miracles for our father in days of old, at this season.

*The following blessing is said only on the first evening (or the first time one kindles the lights this Chanukah):*

3. Baruch Atah Hashem Elokeinu Melech Ha-olam Shehecheyanu Vekiyemanu Vehigianu Lazman Hazeh. Blessed are you, Lord our G-d, King of the universe, who has kept us alive, and has preserved us, and enabled us to reach this season.

## The Story of Chanukah



Every year between the end of November and the end of December, Jewish people around the world celebrate the holiday of Chanukah, the Festival of Lights. Chanukah begins on the 25th day of the Hebrew month of Kislev, but the starting date on the western calendar varies from year to year. The holiday celebrates the events which took place over 2,300 years ago in the land of Judea, which is now Israel.

Long ago in the land of Judea there was a Syrian king, Antiochus. The king ordered the Jewish people to reject their G-d, their religion, their customs and their beliefs and to worship the Greek gods. There were some who did as they were told, but many refused. One who refused was Judah Maccabee.

Judah and his four brothers formed an army and chose as their name the word "Maccabee", which means hammer. After three years of fighting, the Maccabees were finally successful in driving the Syrians out of Israel and reclaimed the Temple in Jerusalem. The Maccabees wanted to clean the building and to remove the hated Greek symbols and statues. On the 25th day of the month of Kislev, the job was finished and the temple was rededicated.

When Judah and his followers finished cleaning the temple, they wanted to light the eternal light, known as the N'er Tamid, which is present in every Jewish house of worship. Once lit, the oil lamp should never be extinguished.

Only a tiny jug of oil was found with only enough for a single day. The oil lamp was filled and lit. Then a miracle occurred as the tiny amount of oil stayed lit not for one day, but for eight days.

Jews celebrate Chanukah to mark the victory over the Syrians and the rededication of the Jerusalem Temple. The Festival of the Lights, Chanukah, lasts for eight days to commemorate the miracle of the oil. The word Chanukah means "rededication".

In America, families celebrate Chanukah at home. They give and receive gifts, decorate the house, entertain friends and family, eat special foods, and light the holiday menorah. ✡

## How to Play Dreidel

The Hebrew word for dreidel is Sevivon, which means "to turn around." Dreidels have four Hebrew letters on them, and they stand for the saying, "Nes Gadol Haya Sham," meaning "a great miracle happened there." In Israel, the saying is, "Nes Gadol Haya Po," "a great miracle happened here."

According to some historians, Jews first played with a spinning top during the rule of the Greek King Antiochus. In Judea, Antiochus had outlawed Jewish worship, so the Jews would use a game with the spinning top as a ruse to conceal that they were secretly studying Torah.

Playing with the dreidel is a traditional Chanukah game played in Jewish homes all over the world. Here's how to play the basic dreidel game:

1. Any number of people can take part in this great game.
2. Each player begins the game with an equal number of game pieces (about 10-15) such as pennies, nuts, raisins, etc.
3. At the beginning of each round, every participant puts one game piece into the center "pot." In addition, every time the pot is empty or has only one game piece left, every player should put one in the pot.
4. When it's your turn, spin the dreidel once. Depending on the outcome, you give or get game pieces from the pot:
  - a. *Nun* means "nisht" or "nothing" in Yiddish. The player does nothing.
  - b. *Gimmel* means "gantz" or "everything" in Yiddish. The player gets the whole pot.
  - c. *Hey* means "halb" or "half" in Yiddish. The player gets half of the pot. (If there is an odd number of pieces in the pot, the player takes half plus one.)
  - d. *Shin* (outside of Israel) means "shtel" or "put in" in Yiddish. *Peh* (in Israel) means "pay." The player adds a game piece to the pot.
5. If you have no game pieces left, you are either "out" or may ask a fellow player for a "loan."
6. When one person has won everything, the round is over!

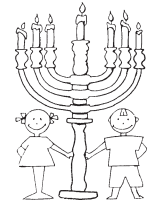


**Two's News**

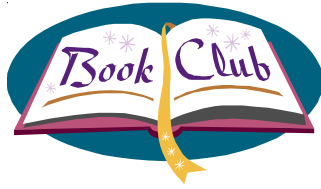

The next Beth Sholom Book Club selection will be **“Beautiful as the Moon; Radiant as the Stars: Jewish Women in Yiddish Stories, An Anthology,”** a collection of short stories translated from Yiddish edited by Sandra Bark. One review/summary states:

“Bark’s appealing anthology gathers 22 stories chronicling Jewish women’s lives in late 19th- and early 20th-century Europe, Russia, the United States and Israel. Though most of the stories were published in the 1920s and ’30s, many in Yiddish newspapers and magazines, their themes—love, thwarted ambition, identity, assimilation—still resonate. The heroines, who are of all ages and classes, find themselves struggling for education, autonomy, equality—just as many of their real-life contemporaries did.” No need to read the whole collection of stories, though it’s really a quick and delightful read, cover to cover! And men will find it just as enjoyable as women have.

difference. Love or hatred can also spread out and fill a large space. It was also a message about how G-d's love and presence is manifested in our lives.

Forty years ago, when my very sweet, loving, wise, hardworking grandmother passed away, an older cousin comforted me by telling me that my grandmother was like the shamash, lighting all the other candles, and that we, her children and grandchildren, were the other candles, carrying on her light. I have continued to believe, over the years, that her kind words are true, and have been inspired by them to try to carry forth my grandmother's wisdom, lovingkindness, and dedication. I also learned to think about people as lights in the world. When people bring love, happiness, and wisdom into my life, or into the world, I think of them as lights. I thought about that metaphor a lot during the two weekends when we had three b'nai mitzvah—Juliana Lynch, Max Cantor, and Adi Singerman. Each of the young people were their own unique selves, each reflected the specialness of their own families, and their events each had some special quality. They each brought light to our synagogue community, and because they happened close together, they brought what felt like a season of light. A further reflection on this theme is that, although one light can fill a room, we light eight candles plus the shamash. This serves as a reminder that our light is



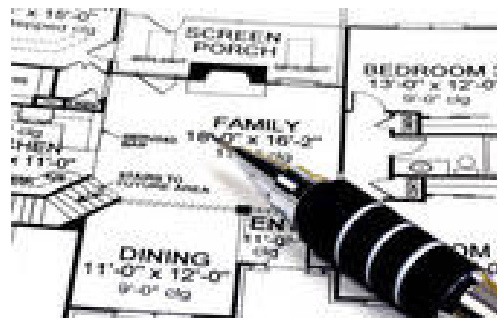
sparked by the much greater light of Hashem, and that when we stand together and share our light with each other, we have a light that is brighter, stronger, and continually being sparked.

Ultimately, it seems to me that when we keep Judaism alive in our families and communities; when we keep alive the memories of our relatives and ancestors; when we do acts of lovingkindness, charity, tikkun olam, or other mitzvot; we are the lights—we are the miracle. I hope you all have a de-light-ful Chanukah, and that you will come to celebrate with your friends at the Beth Sholom/Shoresh Chanukah party on December 5.

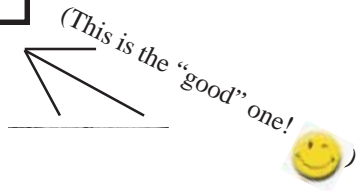

On October 17, 2010, the Shapiro G'Mach/Chesed Committee sponsored Beth Sholom's first congregation-wide Mitzvah Day. It was a tremendous success.

We had over 50 participants who volunteered their time with abandoned animals at Days End Farm Horse Rescue, Inc., cheered up residents with an ice cream social at Northampton Manor Health Care, and honored heroes who make us safe—our firemen. Decorated cupcakes were delivered to the following firehouses: Spring Ridge Fire Station, Westview Fire Station, Carroll Manor, New Market District Volunteer Fire Co., Citizens Truck Co., United Steam Fire Engine Co., Junior Fire Co. and Independent Hose Co. In addition, children and families created cards that will be used for many different occasions—get well, thank you, happy birthday and thinking of you. Many of our Beth Sholom congregants participated, along with Hebrew school and Early Childhood Center students, parents and teachers.

Two activities were ongoing until November 17, 2010. The Winter Coat Drive provided more than 25 adult coats to the Cold Weather Shelter and another 25 children's coats to the Frederick County Department of Social Services. The sale of special custom-made blankets, created by Andrea Eyler, has raised funds for the G'Mach/Chesed Committee, and we will make a donation to the Frederick Memorial Cancer Center Patient Fund. This fund provides financial assistance to cancer patients who are receiving treatment and need assistance with bills, food, childcare needs, etc.

Mitzvah Day was a collaborative effort to promote the importance of giving back to our community by helping those in need, whether the assistance is financial, or simply lending a helping hand or providing a special smile or the comfort of having caring visitors. 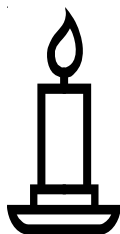
