We will be bidding Rabbi Singerman farewell at the end of this month. I want to express my gratitude, which I know is shared by many congregants, to Rabbi Singerman, for many things he has done here. At the top of the list are his wonderful sermons, which have engaged us on an intellectual level of learning about Jewish commentaries and debates, and also on a more emotional, personal level of incorporating the beauty and wisdom of Torah into our modern lives. His Sunday morning monthly classes have given us an opportunity to wrestle with Jewish questions. His approach to preparing our B'nai Mitzvah students has been a winning combination of building their sense of community through group teaching, and individual teaching, often using Skype. He managed to get right on their level with silly humor and playfulness at times, and still command their respect as he taught them to daven and chant, along with the meaning and importance of what they were learning. We are grateful that he has considered the halachic arguments and opened opportunities for women to be included in our services. With his law and business skills, he made a number of suggestions about how we might reorganize our board and committee structure to be more efficient in making decisions and following through on action plans.

As we wish Rabbi Singerman joy in having more time with his family once he's not spending every other Shabbat in Frederick, and much success in his return to his law practice, we as a Congregation will carry forth the community-building, inclusion, and support of each other that have been strengthened, especially this past year. To help us deal with the transitions, our services will be led by our very capable RAC (Richard Haber, Jeff Rossio, Morrie Kelsey, Andy Rosenfeld) interspersed with visiting rabbis, student rabbis, and cantors, and then to an interim rabbi. We expect that getting to see and interact with a variety of religious leaders will help us get a clear sense of what is the best fit for us within the Conservative spectrum. I have almost finished appointing two ad hoc committees, one for short term planning (six to eighteen months), and the other for longer term planning, to consider where we want to be in the next three to five years. Once we join the Conservative Movement, which will be by the end of January, I will also task the Bylaw Committee with revising our bylaws to support a more effective board and committee process we are learning about. I urge everyone who wants to participate in committees or to express their opinions, or to participate in enhancing our sense of community to contact Marcia or me or any member of the Board. We welcome everyone's involvement. ☆

This month I want to highlight a few of the changes that have taken place around Beth Sholom in the past 6 months. We have instituted a new membership database called Chaverware. On the next page you will find a form that we hope you will print, complete and send back to Janet in the office. I know that many will say, "I don't need to do this. They have all my information." But please do fill it out and bring it or send it back to us. Many times people will change their email address and then wonder why they are not receiving any information from the synagogue – it's because you forgot to tell us. Or you may have gotten a new cell phone number or no longer have a land line. We don't know these things unless you tell us. Also, we would like to make sure that we have all of your correct information in our database. This new program offers us many more capabilities than our old one did. Once we input your updated information, we can connect people by zip codes, interests, grades your children are in, keep in touch with our college students and so much more. So please take a few minutes and fill out and return this form.

Along with our new membership database, we have new financial software. This will enable us to produce clearer reports for the board each month. Crediting your accounts with payments and donations and keeping track of our expenses will be easier and the reporting capabilities are much improved.

We have begun our new Shabbat initiative with Jr. Congregation and Tot Shabbat. Certain events will occur on specific Shabbatot each month, which means you will know ahead of time what's going to happen. Following is the schedule for February, but the monthly schedule will probably change a little in March.

On the first Saturday of each month we have Jr. Congregation led by Andy Rosenfeld, Mitch Abrams and Batya Toso. This interactive service gives our pre Bar/Bat Mitzvah children and their families a wonderful chance to learn the service and have fun at the same time. The children from grades 3 through 7 learn songs, prayers and participate in Parsha Plays. Jr. Congregation is from 10:00 – 11:30am and everyone is invited to join the congregational Kiddush following services.

On the third Friday of each month we have Tot Shabbat at 6:00pm. Mark your calendars for this interactive and fun service led by Richard Haber and Mitch Abrams, when Rabbi Singerman is not in town or by the rabbi when he is here. Everyone with children from 2 to 6 years old is encouraged to join in the fun. We have an Oneg following so the families may have some social time together.

In March we will have the schedule of events for our new initiative in place. Meanwhile, here's what's happening in February:

On Friday, February 3 we will have services at 7:00pm and a speaker following. Our guest speaker will be Doug Gansler, Attorney General of Maryland. He will be speaking about his work on behalf of the Jewish community. I hope you will join us for what should prove to be a very interesting talk.

On Friday, February 10 services will be at 7:00pm and Mora Batya's 3rd and 4th grade religious school classes will be participating by leading songs and prayers. Show your support and come to services.

On Saturday, February 11, we will have our first book discussion following Kiddush. Different board members have volunteered to jump-start this effort by leading the discussion. They have chosen the book "To Be A Jew" by Rabbi Hayim Halevy Donin, a guide to Jewish observance in contemporary life. The discussion in February will be focusing on the first 2 chapters. If you would like to lead a session, please let Gayle Bromberg or me know.

Saturday, February 18, will be our first try at holding a Traditional Minyan in the Weinberg Chapel and our regular services in the sanctuary. We will include a Torah Study during services in the sanctuary, where we will discuss the parsha of the week. Anyone interested in leading a Torah Study session should contact either Gayle Bromberg or me. The Traditional Minyan will need Torah readers. Please let me know if you are able to participate in this service.

On Friday, February 24, we will have a regular Friday evening service at 6:30pm with a Shabbat Dinner following. The theme will be "A Taste of Israel." Keep an eye on your email for more information about this tasty evening. That Saturday we hope to have a scholar in residence, perhaps a visiting cantor or rabbi. We will definitely keep you posted.

So you can see that the Board of Directors and the Program Committee have been very hard at work coming up with new and innovative ways for our community to celebrate Shabbat together. We hope that you will try out the new initiative and give us some feedback. Please remember that non-members are always welcome. Bring a friend – our future lies in your hearts and hands.

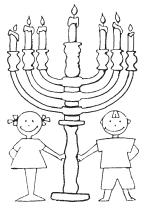

It's that time ... REGISTRATION for the Beth Sholom Early Childhood Center (BSECC) 2012-2013 school year is beginning now.

Current members of Beth Sholom Congregation will have priority to register, and can register beginning on Tuesday, January 3, 2012.

Students who are currently enrolled in the preschool, but whose parents are not members of Beth Sholom, are eligible to register beginning Thursday, January 5, 2012.

Registration is open to the public beginning Monday, January 9, 2012.

BSECC offers twice-weekly classes for two- and three-year olds, and three and five day classes for three- and four-year-olds. We are offering both morning and afternoon classes. Students who are three or four years old who are potty trained are eligible to attend Lunch Bunch, which is offered five days a week.

Please contact Margie Barber, Director, if you have any questions about BSECC. We're looking forward to another great preschool year!

We are also going to begin a Mommy and Me class which will be held on Mondays and Wednesdays from 9:30-11:00am. Please let your friends with younger children know about our program. Mommy and Me is for moms or caregivers and children up to age 3. Social time, arts and crafts projects, movement, snack and more will be included in this new program.
