A number of enjoyable and interesting events have been going on at Beth Sholom, some of them organized by our Program Committee, and some by Sisterhood, Hadassah, NCJW, our Rabbi, or Shoresh. These have given our Congregation a chance to socialize, meet and get better acquainted, make some new friends, learn, hike, take part in doing mitzvot, strengthen our positive relationship with the Frederick community, engage in Jewish learning, and raise needed funds for Beth Sholom and the other associated organizations mentioned above.

Rabbi Singerman has started meeting with our upcoming B'nai Mitzvot on Friday before Shabbat to study and prepare for their bar and bat mitzvah services. This has been a very positive experience for the teenagers, who are bonding with each

other, strengthening their Jewish identity and involvement in the synagogue. I've heard about at least one boy who has already committed to read a second Haftarah soon after his Bar Mitzvah. The Rabbi has also planned a hike combined with study of Maimonides ("Rambam on the Rocks"), in keeping with his dedication to helping us experience and live our Judaism outside the Synagogue.

In our Religious School, as well as through Shoresh, our students are enjoying learning with the aid of computers. Students have been encouraged to answer quiz game questions or compete in writing essays on a given subject, looking up the information on computers. The children who have signed up for the Israel Enrichment class are also having a great time learning in multidimensional ways — through cooking, music, art, computers. Adults have also enjoyed the learning opportunities at Beth Sholom, and many of you are probably aware that there are increased opportunities for learning and participation as we have changed to a triennial Torah reading. Shorter parshas mean that each segment of the reading is shorter and more manageable to

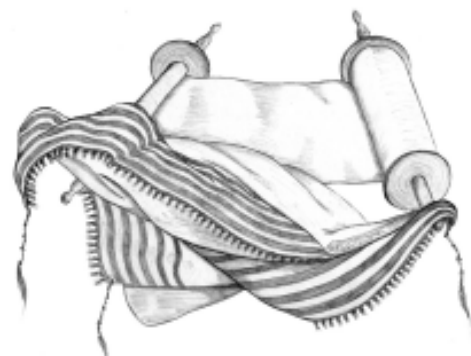

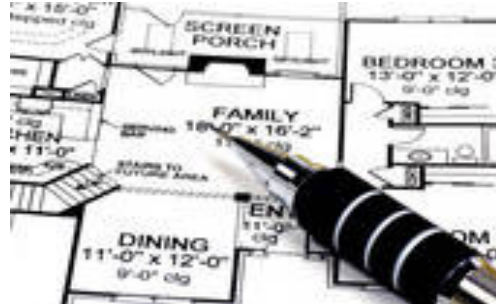

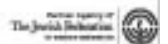
