The President's Corner

Our High Holiday services were a high for me in many respects. As is true every year, I enjoyed seeing so many people whom I respect, admire, and enjoy catching up with — so many people who are part of our congregational community. This year, my mother was here with us, and her happiness about being in the very beautiful sanctuary, surrounded by such warm and welcoming people, was infectious. Her influence enhanced my appreciation of the beauty of the spirit of our congregation and of the Rosh Hashanah liturgy. I know that Rabbi Singerman, Richard Haber, and Morrie Kelsey all put a great deal of time and energy into making the High Holiday services beautiful, meaningful, smooth-running, and accessible to everyone. I have been glad to hear from many congregants, most of whom expressed similar feelings to mine. Many people were particularly appreciative of Rabbi Singerman's captivating and relevant sermons and elucidative Torah talks. Others particularly were thankful that he had thoughtfully balanced the services to include times when we could enjoy our familiar tunes and pace under Morrie Kelsey's leadership, times of more English readings, and times when we could be moved by listening to or davening in the reverent Hebrew melodies. We owe much gratitude to Rabbi Singerman, Richard, and Morrie. I hope that the High Holidays were as inspiring and uplifting to you as they were to me, and that they also made you feel a closer connection to the warm and welcoming Beth Sholom community and our strong Jewish values.

In keeping with my commitment to maintain an open flow of information to our membership about what's going on in the Board meetings and the administrative aspect of the Congregation, I want to share the highlights of recent events and decisions:

- In the Congregational meeting on Sept. 15, the Congregation voted to authorize the Board to sell the house on Second Street. MJ Minton, who is a realtor as well as a member of our Board, has generously provided us with information on comparables, zoning, and imperative repairs, and has filed a proposal with the downtown Historic District Review Commission for removal of the second floor rear porch. We are grateful for MJ's expertise, careful research, and intercession with the Historic District Commission. We are still in the process of determining who should be our realtor. We are committed to a process that will be equitable, transparent, and in the best interest of our Congregation. We may utilize a consultant to make the decision from among the realtors we invite to bid on the job.
- In the same Congregational Meeting, the congregants voted to accept the recommended changes to the bylaws. Reviewing bylaw changes is always a time-consuming, detail-oriented and

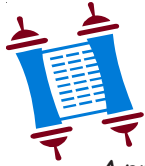

difficult task, and I am grateful to MJ Minton, Chris Eissenstat and Roger Strong for their service on this committee. Despite everyone's best efforts, there are always some details that escape notice and need to be changed in a later revision.

- I have established a Personnel Committee, to evaluate and make sure we are appropriately working with and supporting all employees and contractors of Beth Sholom to fulfill our mission and agreed upon goals. Marty Potash, who has a great deal of expertise in personnel matters, is chairing the committee. He will not actually participate in the evaluations, since his wife, Janet, is on our staff. Marty is offering valuable help in organizing and formalizing the process.
- Ezra Elkon has very generously planned a Casino fundraiser for Beth Sholom, and offered to professionally cater the event, charging only for the cost of the food. This can be an excellent fundraiser *if* we solicit adequate donors to pay \$500 to sponsor each of six tables, and also do well in ticket sales. If you belong to an organization, work for or do business with a company that might want to sponsor a table, please contact them personally to solicit their sponsorship. If you have not already received sponsorship letters or information on e-mail, contact the Community Center office, and we will be glad to get the information to you and prospective sponsors. Additionally, plan to come to the Casino night, and bring your friends, Jewish and non-Jewish. It promises to be a very fun evening, and a great time to socialize with friends. While you have no chance of winning money — there are no cash prizes — you will have the satisfaction of knowing that you are helping to put Beth Sholom in a more solid financial position.

I appreciate everyone who is getting involved in helping Beth Sholom, and everyone who is sharing their positive feelings and ideas, as well as their concerns and suggestions. The Rabbi and other leaders of the Congregation do listen and care about everyone's concerns, though we may not be able to satisfy everyone's wishes. I am continuing to work with the leadership of our Congregation to develop a forum for effective sharing and participation. Please watch your e-mail, if you have e-mail, for notices of meetings. 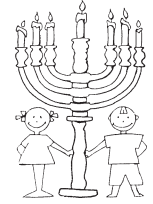

Our next gathering of the Beth Sholom Book Group will meet at 11:30 a.m. on Oct. 24 at the Community Center to discuss the novel "Adjusting Sights" by Haim Sabato. This very sweet and moving story is only 144 pages

(not counting the Hebrew/English glossary), thus a quick read. The translator from Hebrew was Hillel Halkin. Below is a summary of this novel taken from Ma-Kom: The Israeli Engagement Network.

"Adjusting Sights" begins soon after the outbreak of the Yom Kippur war, when 19-year-old Haim returns on leave to his family home in the Jerusalem neighborhood of Bayit ve-Gan. There he grew up with his best friend Dov, an immigrant from Romania. The two studied together at the same yeshiva and shared a tank in an armored corps base in the Sinai. Haim was the gunner; Dov the loader. But in the chaos of war they are assigned to different companies, and Dov is killed in one of the most devastating series of battles in Israel's history. This book is the story of Haim's attempt to uncover the circumstances and come to terms with Dov's death. He describes crossing wadis, ducking shells, and driving across uncertain terrain, interspersing his narrative with the liturgy and the texts of Jewish tradition: 'I have called out to the Lord in distress . . . All the nations compassed me, but in the name of the Lord will I destroy them.' Haim's personal and spiritual journey, woven into the fabric of a great national struggle, makes for a deeply compelling and riveting account that lifts the fog of war to reveal not just the chaos of battlefield, but the forces that tear at the heart of a friend."

Update on Benji Smith's Dominican Project - By Benji Smith

Thanks to everyone who donated funds to help ship baseball equipment to Los Tocones in the Dominican Republic! I traveled with my family to Los Tocones this past June. Los Tocones is a remote village on the beautiful Samana peninsula in the northeast Dominican Republic. We were able to provide three working laptops donated by the non-profit One Laptop Per Child (OLPC) and over 250

pieces of used baseball equipment donated by the Brunswick and Frederick Little Leagues as well as private donations by friends and family. In addition, we carried over 300 Spanish-language books collected by Shari and Howie Scher. I ran a 2-day workshop which focused on teaching kids how to use the computers. I also ran a 1-day workshop to train the teachers how to use the computers and how to best use the various applications with students of different ages. We also delivered all of the books to the library at the elementary school which has now been stocked with over 1000 books collected by Shari and Howie over the past few years. Finally, we had a beautiful ceremony on the town's baseball field where teams from Los Tocones and the surrounding area came to retrieve the baseball equipment that was shipped there in April.

The initial reason for this venture was my Eagle Scout Project, but it has turned into more than that. My family and I fell in love with the village and people of Los Tocones and the larger neighboring town of Las Galeras. I hope to return again this winter with more baseball equipment, more computers donated through OLPC, more books, as well as very much needed school supplies such as pencils, pens and paper. ☆

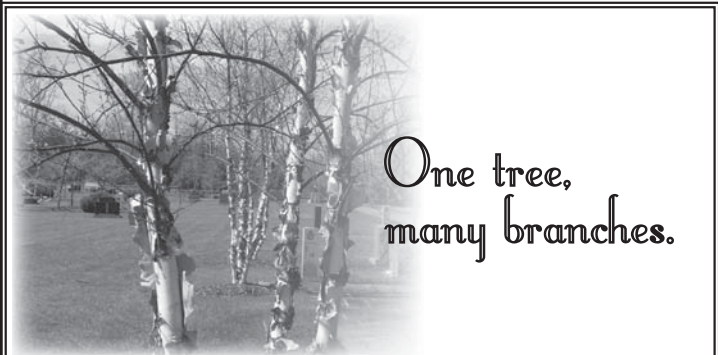
